

South West Music School Child Protection and Safeguarding Process

Who can raise a concern?

- ANYONE can raise a concern of abuse and neglect
- Safeguarding is the responsibility of everyone, not just those who work directly with children

When a young person discloses abuse or neglect:

- Listen; take their allegation seriously; reassure that you will take action to keep them safe
- Inform them what you are going to do next
- · Do not promise confidentiality
- Do not question further or approach/inform the alleged abuser





Discuss concerns with Designated Safeguarding Lead: Jennie Troup (07515 902847)

- The DSL will consider further actions required, gather initial information and offer support and guidance
- · All concerns will be recorded in writing and the Trustees consulted and kept informed
- The Trustee responsible for overseeing SWMS Safeguarding and Pastoral issues is Oliver Leaman
- If an allegation is made against a member of staff, the General Manager, Tracy Hill, will be contacted immediately to laise directly with the Local Authority Designated Officer (LADO)



DSL to assess immediate safety and decide next steps



DSL/Professional discusses concerns with parents/carers of the child and explains what steps they will take next (if this does not put the child at further risk or could affect a police investigation)

Additional/unmet concerns should always be reported again



Report potential criminal activity to Police

Report all concerns to the relevant Local Authority Safeguarding Unit.



Local Authority Action:

- Acknowledge receipt of referral
- · Record details of the concerns
- · Will decide on next course of action (e.g. further assessment, no further action required, or Early Help CAF recommended; referral to other agency for service provision)
